ABOLITION ADVOCACY

"Open your mouth for the mute, for the rights of all who are destitute." Proverbs 31:8

1. Lookup your State Representative and State Senator

- o Find out who represents you:
 - You can use your zip code or county; look for your State Rep and State Senator:
 - https://abolishabortiontx.org/find-my-rep
- o Make a note of their offices and locate them on the Capitol floorplan:
 - https://abolishabortiontx.org/capitol

2. Arrange to meet with your Representative & Senator (or their staff)

- o Find your representative's office contact information.
- o Schedule an appointment in advance, if possible.

3. Talk to your Representative & Senator (or their staff)

- o If no appointments are available, just drop by the office without an appointment.
- o If you are unable to meet with your Representative or Senator directly, talk with their staff instead.
- o Tell them you are a constituent and are here to urge them to support abolition.
- o For the house, ask them to become a co-author on HB 3326 & HB 3641.
- For the senate, ask them to become a co-author on SB 1671 and to amend a pro-life bill to become an abolition bill like HB 3326.
 - The filing deadline for the Senate has passed, so amending is the only option for a Senate Abolition bill this session.

4. Talk to the Public Health committee chairwoman's office

- HB 3326 has been assigned to the Public Health committee, chaired by Chairwoman Rep. Stephanie Klick.
- O Visit her office to ask that HB 3326 be given a hearing.
- Chairwoman Rep. Stephanie Klick, House District 91 is in Room E2.608

5. Be courteous but persistent

- Our main priority is to advocate for the preborn so please wear a mask if you are asked to.
- You may hear many excuses as to why they can't support abolition.
- You may hear about how "pro-life" your Representatives are, but that they can't support abolition.
- Be courteous and respectful:
 - "With patience a ruler may be persuaded, and a soft tongue will break a bone." Proverbs 25:15
- Do not be discouraged or deterred if you are not well received:
 - "Like a muddied spring or a polluted fountain, is a righteous man who gives way before the wicked." Proverbs 25:26
- O You are here to advocate for preborn child who cannot speak for themselves.
- Be specific:
 - "I want Rep. ___ to ..."
 - "I want Senator ___ to ..."

6. Follow-up and leave

- o Ask for a follow-up meeting if possible or how you could speak with your representative directly.
- Move on to your next meeting.
- Leave some literature for the staff and for your representative:

 - HB 3641/SB 1671 one-pager
